

This event underscores our commitment to achieving Sustainable Development Goal 5 - Gender Equality. We believe in creating a society where women have equal opportunities and access to resources, and where their voices are heard and valued. Through this symposium, we aim to shed light on how Islamic principles support gender equality and empower women in various aspects of life.

Additionally, this initiative aligns with Sustainable Development Goal 10 - Reduced Inequalities. We recognize the importance of addressing inequalities in all forms, including those based on gender. By promoting gender equality through academic discourse and collaboration, we take a significant step towards reducing inequalities within our community and beyond.





Encouraging Female Students To Apply

Women's role in building society can't be denied, the need is to educate and train them, so they're able to perform at the peak of their abilities. Gender inequality is dominant in Middle Eastern culture, despite the need of almost every other household for their women to participate in bread-winning due to ever-increasing inflation and a rise in male civilian deaths, during Iraq's latest struggle in the fight against ISIS and during wars and invasions.

The University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa deemed it its responsibility to help build a women-inclusive society. As an educational institution, we believe we can help educate our girls/women to better equip them with resources and potential to be independent enough to support themselves, we, therefore, try our best to maintain a healthy male-to-female ratio and support admission rate by offering dedicated scholarships for deserving students with a large recipient of our scholarship being female. Several scholarship quotas are in place for war-stricken states and governorates during the invasion of ISIS. We make sure to offer women-only quotas for gender-specific seats for scholarships, avoiding any non-binary gender entrance into women's schemes, so as to not limit their chance of acceptance by awarding funded seats to other genders or X.

Special accommodation only for females with high security and subsidized fees with free transportation is offered for all female students, so as to increase the number of applications from female applicants from far-fetched and remote regions of our country. This has shown a remarkable improvement in the application rate from females, as the enrollment of female students in Warith Al-Anbiyaa has increased remarkably over time.

How We're Taking Care of Disadvantaged Groups!!

Each year a percentage of female students drop out of higher education due to financial difficulties or the culture and trend of getting married during higher education, however, little has been done to support the changes being dealt with by newlywed couples. The University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa, therefore, has put several measures in place to help students in similar situations. Other than this, women from far-fetched or remote areas or female students who're the first-ever women to receive a higher degree in their family, who've to face some hurdles and resistance from their families are also on the verge of leaving their studies or not starting at all for worst. We at the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa have tried our best to introduce such a culture and support system in our prestigious university, where everyone can access support system and enjoy the same privileges as other genders on and off campus.

Scholarship quota for female students to maintain the healthy ratio of different genders studying on scholarship, the system is merit-based, however, preference is to be given to a female candidate when competing with male students with similar/competitive percentages and averages.

Loan for dealing with financial difficulties and hardships (accommodating Female students with empathetic female staff, with their privacy fully respected)

Mental health counselling for dealing with ongoing hardships, including but not limited to abusive relationships, depression, anxiety, stress, divorce/breakups, postpartum depression after childbirth, adjusting to a new environment, coping with life after marriage, getting bullied, dealing with post harassment impact

Women mentoring schemes include training for technical and non-technical skills; including workshops for resiliency and English language, topics under the mental health counselling centre, entrepreneurship, helping with new business launch

The female student community centre promotes a sense of belonging for female students who feel intimidated in the new higher education environment and evade the feeling of being left out

Affordable high-standard accommodation with high securities and amenities, with no (or say minimising) return on investment to encourage participation from the low-income sector from remote regions

Free transportation to and fro from the university to the hostel to help students with the cost of living in Karbala, with expensive transportation due to religious tourism

Creating a sense of belonging for female students via anti-bullying, and anti-harassment policies, promoting active female student participation, and women's inclusion in major activities/schemes

Online Module/Virtual attendance option for students in emergency situations or in a new phase of their lives, so as to maximize their participation, making female students encourage to attend virtually instead of dropping out

Parents' involvement, engage with parents to make them interested in their daughter's studies and have a sense of pride in their daughter's achievement. Primarily targeted parents are from conservative backgrounds originating from or residing in small towns and villages, who're not comfortable with the idea of letting their daughters study in higher education institutions.

Student support centre with qualified emotionally intelligent/empathizing staff, trained enough to be a good communicator and listener; never allowing a scenario of letting students down or making them feel embarrassed.

Displacement of students' families due to war or other terrorist activities. Special support programs for girls or female students to support them with their studies via loans, fee deferrals, scholarships, fee instalment options, and preference granted for subsidized housing.

Recognizing the scarcity of water in this region, we have committed ourselves to SDG 6 by establishing thriving nurseries within the university's premises.

Here, we cultivate a diverse range of seasonal and perennial plants, carefully chosen for their ability to thrive in dry, arid conditions. Water Conservation/Recycling Program On Campus

1.Conservation

All the buildings of the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa have a separate sewerage system, for wastewater and for clean water. Rainwater is thus collected from the roofs of the buildings and is then discharged into the local ponds and canals around the buildings. Thus, the rainwater is collected from the roof, parking areas, and other places at the campus and discharged the rainwater into the ponds and channels at our campus. Rainwater is mainly used for watering the green lands at the university and for fountains.






2.Recycling

There is a water treatment plant located right beside our campus area. Although Iraq has a dry climate and doesn't see much rain, especially since our city Karbala has been hit severely by the impact of climate change, we haven't seen much rain in the last years, so the amount of rainwater in Iraq is not that much in comparison with other countries; however, when there is rainwater it is discharged directly to university gardens for watering the trees and plants, for the garden sprinkler system and fountains. And as clean drinking water is necessary for sustaining life and due to the contamination of natural freshwater sources, the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa has an integrated system to purify water at the campus. The water system at the university help in improving the process of transforming wastewater into a clean and recyclable source of drinking water. In this system, the water runs through a series of water filters to remove contaminants and debris and transform wastewater into safe drinking water, water treated by this plant is consumed by students and staff.








Water pollution control in campus area



Warith Al-Anbiyaa Report for Greenhouse Gas Emissions

This report presents a comprehensive analysis of the greenhouse gas emissions for the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa, Karbala, Iraq. The analysis covers Scope 1, Scope 2, and Scope 3 emissions, which are categorized based on the Greenhouse Gas Protocol corporate standards. The aim of this analysis is to identify the university's carbon footprint and propose strategies for emission reduction and transitioning to cleaner energy sources.

Scope 1 Emissions:

Scope 1 emissions encompass direct greenhouse gas emissions that occur from sources owned or controlled by the university. It includes emissions from on-campus activities such as electricity production and transportation.

Calculation:

1. Gasoline used for generators' electricity production: 20,000 liters/month (Estimated 24,000 liters/year)

2. Carbon intensity factor for gasoline: 2.31 kg CO2 per liter (commonly used for gasoline combustion)

Total Scope 1 emissions from gasoline (generators) = 24,000 liters * 2.31 kg CO2/liter = 55,440 kg CO2 (55.44 tonnes CO2)

Scope 2 Emissions:

Scope 2 emissions encompass indirect greenhouse gas emissions from the consumption of purchased electricity, heat, or steam. These emissions occur as a result of university activities but are generated off-campus.

Calculation:

- 1. Total electricity consumption from non-solar sources: 22,500 kWh/year
- 2. Carbon intensity factor for electricity: 0.5 kg CO2/kWh

Scope 2 emissions = Total electricity consumption * Carbon intensity factor Scope 2 emissions = 22,500 kWh/year * 0.5 kg CO2/kWh = 11,250 kg CO2 (11.25 tonnes CO2)

Scope 3 Emissions:

Scope 3 emissions encompass all other indirect greenhouse gas emissions associated with the university's activities, but occur outside the university's boundaries. It includes emissions from off-campus fuel combustion and international flights.

Calculation:

1. Monthly fuel consumption (outside campus): 4,270 liters

2. Carbon intensity factor for gasoline: 2.31 kg CO2 per liter (commonly used for gasoline combustion)

3. Total international flights (one way): 30 (Assuming average distance of 1,500 kilometers for each flight)

Estimated emissions from off-campus fuel combustion = 4,270 liters * 2.31 kg CO2/liter = 9,882.7 kg CO2 (9.88 tonnes CO2)

Estimated emissions from international flights 0 30 flights * 1,500 km * 0.24 kg CO2/passenger-km = 10,800 kg CO2 (10.8 tonnes CO2)

Scope 3 emissions = Estimated emissions from international flights + Estimated emissions from off-campus fuel combustion

Scope 3 emissions ≈ 10.8 tonnes CO2 + 9.88 tonnes CO2 ≈ 20.68 tonnes CO2

Summary of Emissions:

- Scope 1 emissions: 55.44 tonnes of CO2 per year
- Scope 2 emissions: 11.25 tonnes of CO2 per year
- Scope 3 emissions: 20.68 tonnes of CO2 per year

Moving towards Net Zero 2035

This reports indicates that the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa emits a total of 87.17 tonnes of CO2 per year from Scope 1, Scope 2, and Scope 3 sources. The majority of emissions come from gasoline used for electricity generation (Scope 1) and purchased electricity consumption (Scope 2).

To reduce the university's carbon footprint and achieve its sustainability goals, the following measures are being taken gradually to reduce our carbon emissions and cut them by half by 2030:

1. Transition to Renewable Energy: Invest in solar power systems and other renewable energy sources to reduce dependence on gasoline-powered generators and purchased electricity with high carbon intensity.

2.Energy Efficiency: At University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa we are gradually implementing energy-efficient technologies and practices to optimize energy consumption in buildings and other facilities.

3.Sustainable Transportation: Encouraging the use of public transportation, bicycles, and electric vehicles on campus to reduce Scope 3 emissions from off-campus fuel combustion.

4. Offsetting Initiatives: University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa is engaging in carbon offsetting projects such as tree planting or supporting renewable energy projects to compensate for unavoidable emissions.

5. Green Building Designs: The University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa incorporates green building designs in most of its buildings, prioritizing natural lighting and ventilation. Future constructions follow the same sustainable practices, using environmentally friendly materials. These efforts contribute to energy efficiency and align with the university's goal of achieving net-zero emissions by 2035.

The University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa being relatively a new organization is committed to invest with all its capacity towards reaching net zero by 2045 and is already working towards its commitment to sustainability, achieving emission reductions via its clever strategies and implementation of clean energy sourcs, to make a positive contribution to the global fight against climate change.






Smart Building Design Warith Al-Anbiyaa




4.Ramps and paths for wheelchairs at the entrances/towards main buildings/areas/grounds being used by staff and students

Free Transportation Service to Hostelites

We believe the students visiting our university from far-fetched areas especially women from disadvantaged backgrounds or displaced families from the remote regions of Iraq, are under

significant threat to excel in higher education and appear in the field of STEM, keeping that thing in mind, the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa gave 100%, 50% and 10% scholarship to its students and special consideration was given to deserving top students from a financially poor background, were to encourage them to enter a STEM field, we assign 100% scholarships to top 10% of financially disadvantaged students in medicine department. However we know in the Holy city of Karbala, due to its commitment to entertaining massive crowds, the cost of living here can be highly expensive, for that reason, we at the university of Warith Al-Anbiyaa not only provide subsidized housing facilities to our students but also provide free transport services to and fro from university to hostel and back. As for our female students, we have made sure to give them lodging in the city center with complete security and with 24 hours guards presence, although the accommodation lies within tight security of the city provided by the Governorate of Karbala due to the sensitive points nearby, moreover, the area where the hostel is located have markets on walking distance and our students can find stuff for daily needs without any need for commuting. As the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa provides free of cost transportation provided by the Directorate of Imam Hussain Holy Shrine (AS) (Parent organization of the university of Warith Al-Anbiyaa) which serves inside Karbala city to pick up students from their homes/hostel to the university and vice versa about three to five times a day (in total, both to and fro trip combined), we intend to complete our on-campus dormitories for our students so as to avoid commuting expenses and the toll on climate.



Transportation Policy of Warith Al-Anbiyaa

Background:

Since the ever-increasing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions in Iraq over the past few years, from 2015 to 2019 there has been a gradual increase in GHG, according to the World Bank¹, and the trend observed has worsened from the year 2001 to 2019. According to Knoema², "In 2021, CO2 emissions per capita for Iraq was 4.17 tons of CO2 per capita. Though Iraq CO2 emissions per capita fluctuated substantially in recent years, it tended to increase through the 1972 - 2021 period ending at 4.17 tons of CO2 per capita in 2021". One of the major culprits behind the carbon footprint generated by Iraq is petroleum. We at the university of Warith Al-Anbiyaa, being the first ever sustainably active Iraqi private university, has decided to contribute our bit towards responsible consumption by limiting the carbon emissions from transportation. Here are a few initiatives being carried out by our university in the wake of curbing harmful emissions to lessen GHG emissions. They may be small but not for a new and small organization that is trying to lessen its part in climate change, as transportation is one of the major sources of GHGs, and the high cost associated with efficient e-vehicles makes it unattainable for some countries³.

- 1. Free transportation should be provided for students residing in dormitories/off campus
- Because transportation plays a major role in CO₂ emissions, student accommodation dormitories should be provided on campus, so as to avoid driving hours and carbon emissions.
- 3. Rideshares options via social channels made for university students and staff should be encouraged, so as to lessen the number of cars travelling to and fro from campus.
- 4. Parking areas should be limited so as to discourage staff and students from coming via their own vehicles/cars.
- Students may be charged for parking their cars/vehicles, so they may be further discouraged from bringing their own commute options other than ride share, where parking and other cost are equally divided.

- 6. No shaded in-campus parking lot for students be provided to force them to use buses and ride-share options instead via making and appearing it the only economically viable/feasible option for them
- 7. Electric vehicles should be provided for to and fro movements from our sister universities al-Zahra University and Sibtain academy for research collaborations and training programs for selected students' groups and staff. Same vehicles should be used for to and fro movements from nearby buildings under our Parent organizations (Hussainia Holy Shrine)
- 8. Parking fees for electric vehicles should be subsidized or even made free if necessary in an attempt to promote their adoption and use in society
- 9. Financial subsidy should be provided for staff who doesn't own a car and encourage them for using mostly public transport service or rideshare





Psychological Tactics to Encourage a Paperless Office:

We employ several psychological tactics at Warith Al-Anbiyaa University to motivate our employees towards a paperless office, both in text and visuals. Here are some examples:

1. Paper constitutes 50% of business waste.

Solution: Utilize software for data collection and storage instead of relying on paper.

2. Recycling 1 ton of paper saves significant resources.

3. Paper demand is projected to double by 2030.

Solution: Promote email communication for inter and intra-departmental exchanges, minimizing paper usage.

4. Paper accounts for 25% of landfill waste.

Solution: Implement recycling practices for discarded paper materials, either by recycling them or shredding them for use as packing material by our contractors during shipments.

5. The average web user prints 27 pages daily.

Solution: Encourage double-sided printing whenever paper consumption is unavoidable, resulting in a 50% reduction in paper usage.

Treating Campus Waste for Upcycling



Toxic Waste Treatment (from Labs)







Generally, the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa was established in 2017, and thus there is currently no electrical and electronic equipment waste, As for the metal and glass waste, there are separate bins in the university, where waste is collected by the dedicated garbage trucks provided by our parent organization, as the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa is a child organization of the Directorate of Imam Hussain Holy Shrine and located in Karbala / Iraq. The Directorate of the Holy Shrine of Imam Hussain A.S has implemented a single stream Recycling

program to collect all the university recyclables from plastic, paper, glass, and aluminum from the university containers and dump them in the landfill affiliated with the Directorate of the Holy Shrine.



Below is the comparison chart for inorganic waste collection and our green recycling efforts

Every day the university garbage is collected and transported using the garbage decomposer trucks to the specified place; that's a dedicated site for waste collection and processing. The garbage trucks are designed to collect solid wastes.

In the future, the university seeks to provide an inorganic waste collector in which these wastes could be gathered and recovered into valuable metals.





GHG Emissions Reporting

University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa Report for Greenhouse Gas Emissions

This report presents a comprehensive analysis of the greenhouse gas emissions for the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa, Karbala, Iraq. The analysis covers Scope 1, Scope 2, and Scope 3 emissions, which are categorized based on the Greenhouse Gas Protocol corporate standards. The aim of this analysis is to identify the university's carbon footprint and propose strategies for emission reduction and transitioning to cleaner energy sources.

Scope 1 Emissions:

Scope 1 emissions encompass direct greenhouse gas emissions that occur from sources owned or controlled by the university. It includes emissions from on-campus activities such as electricity production and transportation.

Calculation:

1. Gasoline used for generators' electricity production: 20,000 liters/month (Estimated 24,000 liters/year)

2. Carbon intensity factor for gasoline: 2.31 kg CO2 per liter (commonly used for gasoline combustion)

Total Scope 1 emissions from gasoline (generators) = 24,000 liters * 2.31 kg CO2/liter = 55,440 kg CO2 (55.44 tonnes CO2)

Scope 2 Emissions:

Scope 2 emissions encompass indirect greenhouse gas emissions from the consumption of purchased electricity, heat, or steam. These emissions occur as a result of university activities but are generated off-campus.

Calculation:

- 1. Total electricity consumption from non-solar sources: 22,500 kWh/year
- 2. Carbon intensity factor for electricity: 0.5 kg CO2/kWh

Scope 2 emissions = Total electricity consumption * Carbon intensity factor Scope 2 emissions = 22,500 kWh/year * 0.5 kg CO2/kWh = 11,250 kg CO2 (11.25 tonnes CO2)

Scope 3 Emissions:

Scope 3 emissions encompass all other indirect greenhouse gas emissions associated with the university's activities, but occur outside the university's boundaries. It includes emissions from off-campus fuel combustion and international flights.

Calculation:

1. Monthly fuel consumption (outside campus): 4,270 liters

2. Carbon intensity factor for gasoline: 2.31 kg CO2 per liter (commonly used for gasoline combustion)

3. Total international flights (one way): 30 (Assuming average distance of 1,500 kilometers for each flight)

Estimated emissions from off-campus fuel combustion = 4,270 liters * 2.31 kg CO2/liter = 9,882.7 kg CO2 (9.88 tonnes CO2)

Estimated emissions from international flights 0 30 flights * 1,500 km * 0.24 kg CO2/passenger-km = 10,800 kg CO2 (10.8 tonnes CO2)

Scope 3 emissions = Estimated emissions from international flights + Estimated emissions from off-campus fuel combustion

Scope 3 emissions ≈ 10.8 tonnes CO2 + 9.88 tonnes CO2 ≈ 20.68 tonnes CO2

Summary of Emissions:

- Scope 1 emissions: 55.44 tonnes of CO2 per year
- Scope 2 emissions: 11.25 tonnes of CO2 per year
- Scope 3 emissions: 20.68 tonnes of CO2 per year

Moving towards Net Zero 2035

This reports indicates that the University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa emits a total of 87.17 tonnes of CO2 per year from Scope 1, Scope 2, and Scope 3 sources. The majority of emissions come from gasoline used for electricity generation (Scope 1) and purchased electricity consumption (Scope 2).

To reduce the university's carbon footprint and achieve its sustainability goals, the following measures are being taken gradually to reduce our carbon emissions and cut them by half by 2030:

1. Transition to Renewable Energy: Invest in solar power systems and other renewable energy sources to reduce dependence on gasoline-powered generators and purchased electricity with high carbon intensity.

2.Energy Efficiency: At University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa we are gradually implementing energy-efficient technologies and practices to optimize energy consumption in buildings and other facilities.

3.Sustainable Transportation: Encouraging the use of public transportation, bicycles, and electric vehicles on campus to reduce Scope 3 emissions from off-campus fuel combustion.

4. Offsetting Initiatives: University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa is engaging in carbon offsetting projects such as tree planting or supporting renewable energy projects to compensate for unavoidable emissions.

5. Green Building Designs: The University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa incorporates green building designs in most of its buildings, prioritizing natural lighting and ventilation. Future constructions follow the same sustainable practices, using environmentally friendly materials. These efforts contribute to energy efficiency and align with the university's goal of achieving net-zero emissions by 2035.

The University of Warith Al-Anbiyaa being relatively a new organization is committed to invest with all its capacity towards reaching net zero by 2045 and is already working towards its commitment to sustainability, achieving emission reductions via its clever strategies and implementation of clean energy sourcs, to make a positive contribution to the global fight against climate change.

Treating Campus Waste for Upcycling

The Directorate of Imam Hussain's holy shrine (parent organization of the university) incorporates with the municipal of Karbala to develop and improve the university sewers. So they have the duty to clean and maintain those sewers to ensure they serve effectively. Also, they have the duty to empty those sewers either for sewerage treatment works or where appropriate to watercourses. These wastes are very rich in organic materials and with a little treatment, they can be used as a good soil conditioner if they meet a quality protocol.



Toxic Waste Treatment (from Labs)

Since University of Warith AL-ANbiyaa is new and has few colleges which require toxic chemicals for their labs amounting around 2-3 kg per year, these toxic chemicals are handled

effectively by lab technicians, and since we started our journey in 2017 and we are based in low-middle income country, where to depreciation of elevctronic waste are not high and are mostly resold and reused by general public, so most of the electronic waste is being used by university staff or resold to university at cheap prices than market second hand e-devices. 








Water pollution control in campus area

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
